- Mr. McMahon spoke about the need for a 150' JLG lift rental to relocate a dust valve on the silo, and relocate the valve to a lower level of the platform that is accessible via the silo stairs. It would save money in the future.
- East Side Project has been completed finished the wall, filled it in, installed blacktop, and added new track. It is now ready to receive cars and/or aluminum.
- West Pier Project awaiting bid documentation.
- Goble West Side preparation of the sidewalks, laid concrete on the west-side of the pier for the fingers for the marina, more concrete to be poured, and more preparation of the walkways for next phase.

- LT-5 rope has been delivered; anticipate re-tying the vessel soon.
- First load of potash was delivered 04/28/2023.
- First aluminum barge was delivered 04/29/2023.
- Aluminum barge expected at approximately 9:30 AM on 05/16/2023. It will be one 8-hour shift for the longshoremen.
- BBC Washington anticipated arrival on 06/10/2023, with cargo going to the Rochester area.
- Spoke with David Marceau with Castaloop/Logistec, and we are expecting a
 vessel from Finland to arrive in June however we have not spoke about the
 components coming off of that.
- June or July there will be a transformer coming in on rail, and being discharged from rail to truck, being transported to the nuclear plant.
- Potash intake arriving next week; ten railcars of potash will be placed in the domes.
- Ms. Cosemento read a portion of the letter Mr. Scriber submitted to the board.
 Mr. Scriber's return to work is 05/24/2023.

REDI Projects:

Goble Dry Dock

<u>Description</u> - The project involves sediment and rock removal within the former dry dock area to establish the necessary draft and harbor limits for dockage to be installed to accommodate at least 22 vessels within the formal limits of the former dry dock and extending northward along the shoreline behind Derrick Boat 8.

Status - The project is approximately 75% complete.

- There are a few areas remaining where sidewalks still need to be poured, light poles installed and then top soil and seed placed.
- Utility infrastructure is mostly in place. Final water connection needs to be completed at the City water main.
- Electrical gear is scheduled to arrive in late August. National Grid has completed their upgrade work needed at the street.
- Docks continue to arrive on site. We are in the process along with WD Malone to find a subcontractor to install spud piles which must be drilled into the rock in order to secure the docks in place.
- Bathroom upgrades have not been started. WD Malone currently using pavilion space to secure tools and equipment.

<u>Schedule</u> – Expect docks to be set and spud poles to be installed in July/early August. Electrical is expected to be installed in September upon arrival of electrical gear. Connection to City water main expected to be completed in late July or August. Estimated completion to allow boats to dock without utilities or amenities, August 1. Estimated full project completion, October 31.

FEMA Projects

West Terminal Pier

<u>Description</u> - This project involves reconstruction of the north end of the West Terminal Pier to repair/replace the existing timber cribbing and concrete cap that was damaged during the lake's recent high water levels and waves/surges from storm events.

<u>Status</u> – Engineering design is completed and bid documents have been prepared. The project will be ready to advertise as soon as the MWBE goal waiver is received from NYSESD. Environmental permits may not be issued at the time when the project is advertised however, will be complete and in-hand prior to the selected Contractor commencing work.

- Expect environmental permits are expected to be issued within the coming weeks based on correspondence with the NYSDEC on June 20. Please note that since the project is funded by FEMA, the EPA will have up to 30-days to review the project, in particular the environmental permits prior to construction being able to commence.
- A minority goal participation waiver request was initiated with NYSESD in November 2022 to reduce goals from the Port's standard 36% rate (15% MBE, 15% WBE, 6% SDVOB) based on the scope of work included in the project. C&S has prepared the waiver request, including Good Faith Effort documentation requesting goals be reduced to 22% (11% MBE and 11% WBE). The GFE was submitted June 20th requesting an expedited review be performed as directed by the ESD. Please note that the NYSESD often did not correspond in a timely manner, resulting in the process being delayed. Lastly, Contractor's bidding the project will be required to either provide documentation committing to meeting the project's established goals or will be required to prepare their own Good Faith Effort (GFE) documentation explaining why they can't that will need to be submitted, reviewed and accepted by the NYSESD prior to the Port being able to issue a Notice of Award

<u>Schedule</u> - The project is expected to be advertised as soon as the NYSESD approves the minority participation goal waiver request, hopefully in the July/August 2023 timeframe. Construction may being in the fall of 2023 however, likely will not begin in full until spring 2024.

FEMA Projects, cont'd

East Terminal Project

<u>Description</u> - This project involved performing localized repairs to an approx. 100 ft length of the existing steel sheet pile pier wall to prevent continued loss of retained material from behind the wall. It also involved filling in the resulting voids in the surface behind the pier wall and restoration of the 2 existing railroad tracks parallel to the dock that had settled and shifted to the point where they were no longer in service.

<u>Status</u> – The project was substantially completed at the end of April 2023. We are waiting for wheel stops to be delivered and installed on the south ends of the 2 railroad tracks along the dock. Due to the steel sheeting and new concrete cap extending out about 3' from the existing concrete cap, a steel and timber transition is being developed to be installed along the face of the existing concrete cap immediately north of the repaired area to soften the transition for vessels. This transition piece will be fabricated and installed this summer.

Grain Handling Improvements Project

<u>Description</u> - Bid Packages 1, 2 & 4-6 have been completed. Bid Package 3 & 7 remains open. The SEQR for Dome 4 as required by the Judge's ruling is being prepared and will be presented to the Board at a future time to be determined.

Bid Package 1 (Dome 1 Demolition); Completed

Bid Package 2 (Ground Stabilization); Completed

Bid Package 3 (Dome 4 Construction); Remains open until construction completed following completion of SEQR

Bid Package 4 (Grain Equipment, Foundations and Controls); Completed

Bid Package 5 (Electrical Infrastructure, Site Lighting and Grain Elec.); Completed

Bid Package 6 (Grain Control/Lab Building [sub packages - Wick's Law]); Completed

Bid Package 7 (Site Infrastructure Improvements); Corresponds with work remaining under Bid Package 3 for Dome 4

<u>Schedule</u> – Completion of the construction of Dome 4 is dependent upon timing of completion of the SEQR.

Other Projects/Task Assignments

East 1st Street

<u>Description</u> – Evaluation of the turning movements of a Type 1 permit truck entering and traveling south along East 1st Street along the designated NYS truck route departing from the Port.

<u>Status</u> – Evaluated the turning movements of a Type 1 permit truck entering and traveling south along East 1st Street to identify what the removal limits of the raised vegetated median and mid-block sidewalk and crosswalk extension would be. A conceptual plan showing the necessary modifications was prepared and provided to the Port and presented to the City on June 20th.

Schedule - As needed.

Vinegar Hill RV Park

<u>Description</u> – Preparation of the SEQR and engineering support as needed for sewer connection to City force main

<u>Status</u> – Prepared and delivered SEQR in January 2023. Continue to provide engineering support as needed for sewer connection to City force main.



Economic Development Administration (EDA) Grant Applications



<u>Status</u> – Grant was submitted 3/31/2023. We are currently responding to questions and requests for additional information from the EDA reviewers.







Goble Dry Dock Marina 6/20/2023



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MOVING FORT OF OSWEGO IS MAKING MOVES TO PREPARE FOR THE FUTURE By Christine R. Rohn-Tielke FOR THE FUTURE A ROHN-Tielke

f you stand still, nothing happens," said William Scriber, executive director and CEO of the Port of Oswego Authority (POA). "You must move forward."

Scriber has held this position for four years, but he also worked for the POA for several years prior to becoming its director. Over these past four years, Oswego has definitely moved forward. In fact, in three of those four years, including 2022, the Port of Oswego received the Robert J. Lewis Pacesetter Award given by the Great Lakes St. Lawrence Seaway Development Corporation to U.S. Great Lakes ports that have experienced major increases in cargo tonnage.

Oswego celebrated a record year in 2022. Shipping was up 300 percent over 2021, with the port receiving 154,250 metric tons of cargo.

"Our 2022 performance firmly establishes us as a Great Lakes commerce force and a gateway to the world," Scriber said. In fact, its strategic location puts. Oswego fewer than 350 miles from 60 million people. "We're also the gateway from Lake Ontario to the New York State Canal system, with the entrance through Lock 8 here in Oswego," he said. Additionally, the Port of Oswego recently received a U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) designation as a USDOT Martine Highway, one of only 32 such designations in the United States.

port on the Great Lakes "That means we operate as a business," Scriber said "We own all our own equipment, from forklifts to cranes "We support our own infrastructure needs, from roofs to rails to computer software. We have our own labor and have specific labor



agreements." In effect, the port oversees projects across all aspects of port operations.

"We have been very successful with that," Scriber said.

Today's multimodal operation moves commodities via vessel, truck and rail. Current cargo handled includes grain, aluminum, salt, fertilizer, petroleum products, cement, nuclear power plant components, windmill parts and more.

More than two centuries ago, in 1799, Oswego was designated by the U.S. Congress as the first port of entry into the young country. Later, in 1828, the Oswego Canal connected to the New York Barge Canal, creating the most direct route from the Atlantic to the Great Lakes. Major commodities handled throughout the early years included furs, salt, lumber, grain, and coal.

Harbor and port operation evolved over the years. The current Port of Oswego Authority (POA) was created in 1960. Between 1960 and 1963, physical changes were made, creating the current port layout on the Oswego River's east side. Additional major physical improvements over the last 10 years include upgraded rail access and service, heavy equipment acquisition, marine improvements, and expansion of container facilities. In addition to its ideal location in central New York. there are no overhead restrictions, and the location provides access to relatively uncongested over-the-road travel routes. Scriber pointed out that the Port of Oswego is currently operating at 110 percent occupancy.

Foreign Trade Zone

In February 2023, the Port of Oswego obtained Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ)





designation for goods arriving by boat, truck, or rail. When goods come into the FTZ, companies will save time and money on duties, tariffs and production costs. FTZs allow for no duties and federal excise taxes to be paid until a finished product is brought from the FTZ to the domestic market or a NAFTA country.

According to Leonard Rauch, senior economic development specialist for the Onondaga County Office of Economic Development, another FTZ advantage is that manufacturing operations can be established within an FTZ, and scrap or byproducts would not be subject to duty

"We just got the [FTZ] okay a month ago," Scriber said in early March. "This time next year, we'll have a busy, thriving FTZ. As an FTZ, we can offer additional benefits to businesses working with us at the port. Businesses pay no duty on commodities while in an FTZ until they are released for consumption." Other user advantages include streamlining logistics and the ability to closely track inventory.

The fact that Oswego is the only FTZ on Lake Ontario is "another arrow in



our quiver," Scriber said. "A number of companies are now interested in locating their goods here."

There are currently 191 active FTZs in the 50 states and Puerto Rico, with more than 3,200 companies utilizing the program.

Cargo and Cooperation

Oswego also boasts the only grain export facility on Lake Ontario in New York. About 100 local farmers are now sending grain to market via the port facilities. Scriber said that Oswego



usually handles one of the first Seaway grain export cargoes of the season, and 2023 should be no different.

The port's Regional Agricultural Export Center opened a USDA, state-of-the-art grain testing lab in May 2022. Oswego's two-year-old grain silo holds up to 22,000 metric tons and currently operates at 100 percent capacity. Adding another silo is a real possibility. The current shiploader handles 18,000 bushels per hour. There are plans to add another, operating at 30,000 bushels

per hour.

"We are the second largest importer of prime aluminum on the Great Lakes," Scriber said. Close to 500 aluminum slabs were received in 2022. They supply the Novelis plant in Oswego.

In 2022, the Port of Oswego handled more than 300 wind turbine tower sections, blades, and other large components.

"This is a specialized service that we pride ourselves on and have mastered over the years," Scriber said. In fact, Oswego cooperated with the Port of Monroe, Michigan, in handling wind tower sections. Manufactured at Monroe by Ventower Industries, 90 tower sections were loaded onto US-flag barges for shipment to the Port of Oswego, where they were staged with other components for delivery to a project in upstate New York.

"We hope to work again with Monroe," Scriber said.

Upgrades

Over the past year and a half, the port invested in upgrading and expanding its capabilities, and the process continues this year. Last year, Oswego saw \$7 million in east dock upgrades and \$4 million in west pier retaining wall and dock reconstruction. \$17 million in federal funding was earmarked for critical repairs to the entire harbor breakwater, including the foundation of West Pierhead Lighthouse. A \$2.1 million contract was awarded for construction of a new deep-water marina with modern docks and facilities.

Also in 2022, an agreement was signed between the port and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to deepen Oswego's harbor, making it accessible to Seawaymax container ships.

Vision


"We are planning for short sea container shipping," Scriber said.

Part of Oswego's Vision 2030 Comprehensive Plan, which was prepared in March 2021, is to create a short sea shipping project on Lake Ontario with direct connection to other major Great Lakes ports. One of the key components identified for this service was a high reach stacker.

In October 2022, the port secured a USDOT Maritime Administration Marine Highways Grant for \$754,000 toward a low-emission reach stacker. This will expand Oswego's ability to load and unload containers, both on cargo ships and rail, ensuring the port's capability to enter the containerized cargo movement. Total cost is estimated at \$900,000.

"Our board is focused on making the port a premier transportation facility," said Francis Enwright, POA board chair. "Acquisition of this new equipment is vital to our vision and our ability to serve our customers, present and future."

In 2023, the port continues to seek new customers, particularly for agricul-



ture products and wind turbines, while planning for additional growth.

"We have to think outside the box," Scriber said. "We can't rest on how things used to be."

For instance, a proposed solar-heated warehouse would service Novelis and possible future customer Micron. Both companies require heated space. The environmentally friendly warehouse would use rooftop solar panels to provide radiant floor heat. A Port Infrastructure Development Program (PIDP) grant would provide funding.

Rail

Over the past several years, the port has also increased its rail capacity. In addition to renovation of existing rail, a spur was added for 12-14 rail cars. Upcoming rail improvements, pending grant approval, include the addition of two tracks into the port (making a total of five), and a totally electric engine able to move 12 cars at a time.

Other Facilities

The Port of Oswego is also home to the H. Lee White Maritime Museum, opened in 1982, which is looking to expand its footprint into a new and larger building.

'We've been working with them to find funding for a new museum," Scriber said.

Construction of a new museum building is part of a bigger plan to attract more port business, including cruise ships. "Lake cruises are in Lake Ontario now. They haven't been here because we don't have a dock facility for them. The current museum building would work well."

Washington Fly-In

During the first week of March, the American Great Lakes Ports Association (AGLPA) held its first Washington, D.C., fly-in since the Covid-19 pandemic. Port executives from around the Lakes - including Scriber - met with U.S.senators and representatives, congressional committee staff and maritime and environmental agency leaders, as well as each other.

"Our view is a commercial view," Scriber said. "It is important that we have open lines of communication with decision makers."

In Washington, Scriber met with Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg, as well as Adam Tindall-Schlicht, Great Lakes St. Lawrence


Seaway Development Corporation administrator; and Representative Marcy Kaptur (OH), co-chair of the Great Lakes Task Force, working with the newly created Great Lakes Authority, which will be involved with the region's transportation infrastructure.

Scriber noted that other ports are also making great progress. New ideas are flowing.

"We can work together and speak with one voice to make the entire system more vibrant," he said.

He added, "Our investments over the past several years at the Port of Oswego are gaining notice, with several new customers looking to come to Oswego. My mission is how to make it bigger, better and more resilient than ever. But none of this happens overnight. We are a great port that is growing. We're doing what ports and intermodal centers are supposed to do. And we have a great staff to work with. It takes a team."

Moving forward – indeed.





Ports & FTZs: Expand The Reach Of Commerce

Support from federal and local governments has allowed ports across the United States to increase its import and export capabilities.

Oswego County, New York: Home To The Port Of Oswego

Situated in central New York, Oswego County is located proximally to New York City, Boston, Philadelphia, Cleveland, Toronto, and Montreal. Yet, Oswego County has more to offer industries than an attractive location within hours of every major northeast market.

Oswego County has many options for multimodal transport of raw materials, parts, and products. The various combinations of transport are ideal for materials import and product export. What is unique to Oswego County is a port, with the ability to ship internationally.

The Port of Oswego, a deepwater port on the southeastern shore of Lake Ontario, provides a major logistical advantage to the industry in Oswego County and the Central New York region. As the first port of call and hub in the Great Lakes St. Lawrence Seaway System, it is part of over 2,300 miles of water transportation from Duluth, MN to the Atlantic Ocean. The Port of Oswego can accommodate on-dock rail and truck loading, making for a smooth transition of goods to market.

As one of four contiguous counties forming Foreign Trade Zone 90, Oswego County is aligned for the convenient and cost-effective production of goods. The Port of Oswego Authority (POA) is now also a Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ) for goods arriving by ship, truck, or rail. The Port's FTZ is under the umbrella of Foreign Trade Zone 90. FTZ 90 acts as a conduit to the Port of Oswego and other zone partners for business growth and expansion.

As an FTZ, the port can offer many benefits to businesses. Goods can be stored in an FTZ indefinitely, as opposed to a limited time in a bonded warehouse. Those goods are not subject to quota restrictions and can be entered into U.S. commerce at any time. In addition, if goods become obsolete or pass expiration while in a FTZ, they can be destroyed without paying any duty on them. Other advantages for businesses include streamlining their logistics and the ability to closely track their inventory.

Additionally, companies can establish manufacturing operations within an FTZ, and any scrap or byproducts would not be subject to duty fees. For businesses that haven't been able to justify the upfront costs of applying for an FTZ, there would now be savings by taking advantage of the Port's FTZ to bypass those costs.

The Port recently signed an agreement with the Army Corps of Engineers to deepen the Oswego Harbor near the port. This will expand the Port's capabilities and spur growth. Upon completion, the Port would be capable of accepting shipments from Seawaymax Class freighters.

The Port of Oswego had a record year in 2022, with shipping alone up over 300% compared to 2021. Its strategic location at the crossroads of the northeastern North American shipping market, puts them less than 350 miles from 60 million people. Products can get anywhere they need to go, nationally or internationally, from the Port of Oswego and Oswego County, NY.



BANK AGREEMENT AND LESSOR'S ESTOPPEL

WHEREAS, EASTHAMPTON SAVINGS BANK, a Massachusetts banking corporation, with an office at 36 Main Street, Easthampton, Massachusetts (the "Bank") entered into certain financial transactions, dated as of April 29, 2021 (the "Loan"), with WT TERMINAL OSWEGO, LLC, a New York limited liability company with a principal place of business located at 112 Amherst Road, Sunderland, Massachusetts (the "Tenant") and in consideration thereof, THE PORT OF OSWEGO AUTHORITY, a duly constituted Authority of the State of New York and having a principal place of business in the City of Oswego, Oswego County, New York (the "Lessor"), the lessor under the terms of an Amended and Restated Lease Agreement dated April 29, 2021 (the "Lease"), by and between the Lessor and Tenant pertaining to a portion of the premises known and designated as TAX PARCEL ID # 128.38-01-02.01 (the "Leased Premises"), and

WHEREAS, Tenant delivered a Collateral Assignment by Lessee As Collateral Security dated April 29, 2021 and recorded in the office of the Oswego County Clerk on May 5, 2021 as Instrument # R-2021-005046 to secure an obligation of Tenant repay to Bank a loan in the original principal sum of \$7,600,000 in accordance with the terms of the aforementioned Collateral Assignment (the "Collateral Assignment"), and

WHEREAS, the Bank also claims a security interest in Tenant's Personal Property located at the Leased Premises.

NOW, **THEREFORE**, in consideration of \$1.00 and other good and valuable consideration, the Tenant, the Bank, and the Lessor agree as follows:

- Lessor shall provide the Bank a copy of any Notice of an Event of Default as required by the paragraphs of the Lease entitled "Event of Default" and "Notices". Lessor and Tenant agree that the Bank shall have the same rights as Tenant of notice and opportunity to cure the defaults listed in the paragraph of the Lease entitled Events of Default subparagraph (a), (b), and (c) for its own benefit, but only subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement and/or the Lease. Except as expressly provided herein, nothing in this Agreement shall limit the right of Lessor to commence and prosecute to conclusion eviction proceedings or other actions that might result in removal of the Tenant or that may impair or affect the collateral of the Bank. All capitalized terms not defined herein shall have the meaning defined in the Lease (which shall be in the form of Exhibit A when amended).
- 2. The Bank shall have the right to require Lessor to forbear from terminating the Lease and/or commencing an eviction proceeding or an ejectment action only if the Bank advises Lessor of its intention to take possession of the Premises in writing and actually cures all defaults on or before Lessor has the right to terminate the Lease. If the Bank exercises this right, the Bank shall make all payments required by Section 3 of this Agreement and shall be entitled to maintain possession and exercise Tenant's right, for a period of ninety (90) days, or such longer period as is authorized in writing by the Lessor, to assign the Lease in accordance with the Section of the Lease entitled "Assignment/Sublease" solely for the Use required by the Lease. Notwithstanding this Agreement, the Bank shall have no affirmative obligation to cure any or all outstanding defaults during any period that are capable of being cured or to exercise the rights under this Agreement. Cure by the Bank on any occasion will not be deemed to

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- require any such cure on any other occasion. If within the aforementioned periods the Bank actually cures all applicable defaults under the Lease prior to termination of the Lease, then at the Bank's request, the Bank shall have the rights set forth herein.
- 3. To the extent that the Bank desires to prevent the termination of the Lease according to the terms of this Agreement and desires to attempt to exercise its rights under the Collateral Assignment, and subject at all times to Lessor's authority under the terms of the Lease, the Bank may cure the defaults as stated in Section 1 and if the Bank exercises its rights under Section 2, the Bank shall have the rights of Tenant to assign the Lease for the Use under the Lease for the period set forth in Section 2 so long as the Bank pays all past due and ongoing Rent and Additional Rent under the Lease and all other obligations required by the Lease (collectively, "Payment Obligations"); provided that with respect to Payment Obligations relating to Rent and Additional to become due and insurance only: (a) Rent and Additional Rent for any period arising after the cure of all defaults by the Bank shall be determined on a per diem basis for the period for which the Lessor forbears or is prevented from terminating the Lease and/or commencing eviction or ejectment proceedings; (b) the Dockage and Wharfage charges shall be at minimum the average Dockage and Wharfage charges to the Tenant over the year prior to Tenant's default, but charged on a per diem basis for the period for which the Lessor forbears or is prevented from terminating the Lease and/or commencing eviction or ejectment proceedings; (c) the insurance shall be continuously maintained by the Bank for the entire period that the Bank exercises its rights under this Agreement.

Notwithstanding anything in this document to the contrary, Personal Property means tangible personal property owned by Tenant but does not include any personal property, fixtures, machinery, or equipment that the Lessor, as the owner of the Premises and/or as an Authority of the State of New York, owns or in which Lessor has an interest, including without limitation, all tanks, gas pipelines, and the dock(s). The Personal Property as of the date of this Agreement consists of two pumps and two mixers. If the Bank exercises its rights under Sections 1-3 of this Agreement, it shall be entitled to remove the Personal Property from the Premises or sell the Personal Property to a permitted assignee of the Lease; provided that the Bank shall remediate any damage to the Premises caused by any removal or other actions to exercise its rights in addition to the Payment Obligations as provided in Section 3.
- - (a) The Lease is still in full force and effect.
 - (b) Lessor knows of no default or Event of Default which with the giving of notice or the passage of time, or both, exists on the part of Tenant under the Lease, except for any obligations of Tenant under the Lease which have accrued but not yet have come due.
 - (c) No rent or advance rent has been paid by the Tenant to the Lessor except as required or permitted pursuant to the Lease.

- 6. This Waiver and Assent Agreement shall be binding upon Tenant, the Bank, Lessor and their respective successors and permitted assigns and shall inure to the benefit of the Bank and Lessor and their respective successors and assigns.
- This Agreement shall in all respects be deemed to have been entered into in the State of New York. The rights and obligations of the parties hereunder shall be governed by, and construed and enforced in accordance with, the laws of the State of New York. The parties expressly consent to personal jurisdiction in the State of New York with the exclusive venue in the Courts of the State of New York located in Oswego County, New York.
- 8. No right or remedy of Lessor shall be waived, modified, limited, or changed except in a signed writing and no waiver, modification, limitation or change of a right or remedies shall be a waiver, modification, limitation, or change of another or different right or remedy or shall constitute a waiver, modification, limitation or change of a future right or remedy. This Agreement may be executed in more than one counterpart with each counterpart constituting an original but all counterparts constituting a single Agreement. Signatures transmitted in .pdf format by email or fax shall be treated as originals for all purposes.
